Last week, the State Legislature held its final budget hearing for the FY 21-22 state budget cycle, on Health-related issues. I asked Commissioner Zucker about the prospect of establishing a State-run COVID-19 vaccination site that is dedicated for Manhattan residents only. Unlike the Bronx, Brooklyn, and Queens, our borough does not have a State-run site with an allotment of vaccines reserved for our residents only. As the vaccine rollout continues and the U.S. ramps up vaccine production I will continue to advocate for a State-run site dedicated to Manhattan residents
