**Highlights**

1. Election Day was last Tuesday, November 2nd, and the Assemblymember is looking forward to continue working with our colleagues in the City Council, as well as with Councilmember-elect Julie Menin.
2. The Assemblymember is pleased to see that the people of New York City voted Yes on adding the new environmental constitutional amendment, but is disappointed in the voting rights amendments not being passed. The Assemblymember will continue to work in Albany this upcoming session to deliver protections for voters and make voting more accessible to New Yorker's across the state.
3. The Assemblymember joined fellow colleagues and various advocacy organizations in urging the Governor to resist cuts to service, and instead further invest in our public transportation system. With falling ridership, federal aid running out, increased extreme weather events, and more, the MTA's finances remain in a precarious position. As a result, the agency announced that cuts to service may still be on the table for 2023. Working people would disproportionately bear the brunt of this burden. All New Yorkers deserve reliable and easily accessible public transit.
