"A native of Central Harlem and graduate of Harvard University and Harvard Law School, Alvin has served as Chief Deputy Attorney General in New York State, Executive Deputy Attorney General for Social Justice, and Assistant U.S. Attorney in the Criminal Division of the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York. Throughout his career, he has led a number of high-profile investigations and prosecutions, while also serving as a fierce advocate for tenants' rights, civil rights, and human rights." Manhattan District Attorney Cy Vance, Jr., and Exodus Transitional Community today celebrated the grand opening of the first-of-its-kind Exodus Center for Trauma Innovation ("ECTI") located in East Harlem and serving Northern Manhattan. The Center, funded with an \$8 million grant from the D.A.'s Office's Criminal Justice Investment Initiative ("CJII"), which D.A. Vance created using millions seized in investigations against major banks, addresses the needs of individuals exposed to trauma, focusing on community members who have historically faced higher rates of violence and lacked access to services, including adults with justice involvement, young adults, the LGBTQIA+ community, and immigrant populations.
