Highlights

1. The Congresswoman held a roundtable to discuss sexual harassment and verbal abuse at the Washington Commanders organization, previously known as the Washington Football Team (WFT), under the leadership of owner Dan Snyder and the National Football League's (NFL) failure to address this misconduct. Rep. Maloney kicked off the new year by leading a discussion on environmental justice and the issue of CHP plants proposed for Stuyvesant Town
2. Congresswoman Maloney I teamed up with NYCHA Residents' Association Leadership and environmental justice advocates to introduce her Justice in Power Plant Permitting Act, which advances the equitable transition to a clean energy economy by preventing the permitting of major sources of pollution that cause harm to communities, like fossil fuel-fired power. Her legislation would also stop the permitting of other fossil fuel-fired sources within one mile of a major source if the combined effects of the area's air pollutants would cause harm to the health and well-being of local communities.
3. Last week, the Congresswoman joined President Joe Biden, Attorney General Merrick Garland, Governor Kathy Hochul, Mayor Eric Adams, P.S. 111 Principal Dionne Jaggon, and other elected officials for the President's visit to P.S. 111, the Jacob Blackwell School, to discuss gun violence prevention and community violence intervention initiatives and programs.
4. Rep. Maloney sent letters to five members of the Boards of Directors of the four fossil fuel companies who declined her invitation to testifying at a hearing on Tuesday, February 8th. These letters demanded that they attend and give their testimony at a third hearing which is scheduled to be on March 8, 2022.
