### Highlights

1. Carlina has introduced 20 pieces of legislation on a wide array of issues, including a package of bills to confront the [housing crisis](#), a package of bills championing [people-powered mobility](#), and bills to address [ambulance noise](#), establishing a [climate migrant coordinator](#), and calling for a [Patients Bill of Rights](#), among others. 3. Carlina rallied at City Hall to call for funding in the FY 2023 budget for more senior services, more sanitation services, and equitable funding for our Asian American Pacific Islander communities.

Carlina joined Mayor Adams and leaders in the Ukrainian community to announce the dedication of \$2 million in funding to provide Ukrainians in New York City with culturally humble legal and social services, case management, and ongoing support, especially for refugees who have come to New York since the war began.
5. Carlina joined the Alliance for Kips Bay and Murray Hill Neighborhood Association at St. Vartan's Park for an Earth Day celebration with neighbors, families, and students from local schools. Attendees learned about composting, assisted with litter pick-up, and enjoyed a whole day of playground action together.
