

Manhattan Borough President Mark Levine's December 14, 2022 Full Board Report to Manhattan Community Board 6

1) Open Meetings Law:

Mayor Adams has issued Emergency Executive Order 267 (<u>https://www.nyc.gov/office-of-the-mayor/news/267-003/emergency-executive-order-267</u>), which extends the COVID-19 Emergency Declaration for 30 days through December 20, 2022. This Emergency Executive Order enables community boards to have entirely virtual meetings.

2) 2023 Manhattan Community Board Application Open through March 17, 2023:

3) Winter Coat Drive for Asylum Seekers:

The Manhattan Borough President's Office is continuing to partner with the New York Immigration Coalition to provide needed items to asylum seeker families, via our donation drive at both our downtown and uptown offices.

The drive has been very successful, yet the need remains high for new toiletries and hygiene products and new packaged items, including underwear, t-shirts, socks, and diapers. We have also received requests for winter coats and jackets.

4) Get Your Updated Covid Booster and Flu Shot!

Bellevue Hospital welcomes walk-ins Mondays through Saturdays from 7:30 am to 4:00 pm. There is no cost for updated covid boosters and flu shots at Bellevue Hospital, regardless of insurance or immigration status. Updated covid boosters and flu shots are also available at pharmacies, public hospitals, and via home visit for those who are 65 or older or are homebound.

The bivalent booster shot is available and that vaccines are available to the public at NYC Health + Hospital sites such as Bellevue in Manhattan, as well as most local pharmacies.
