Highlights

- 1. For the second consecutive year, District Attorney Bragg announced \$20,000 in funding to up to ten Manhattan community-based organizations for summer youth gun violence prevention programs. The funding will be used to pay young New Yorkers stipends to participate in meaningful programming or to enhance and beautify public spaces that are known areas for gun violence. "Combatting gun violence in our communities remains my top priority as District Attorney and that mission becomes all the more important as we head into the summer months," said DA Bragg.

The Manhattan District Attorney's Office will be hosting a Gun Buyback event in partnership with the NYPD at Memorial Baptist Church located at 141 West 115th Street on June 10th from 10:00am 4:00pm. The Gun Buyback will offer community members the opportunity to anonymously turn in their firearms in exchange for prepaid gift cards and/or an iPad. The Office will be releasing more information about the buyback in the coming weeks.
