Highlights:

Committee on Housing and Buildings Holds Hearing on Vacant and Neglected Properties In the midst of a persistent housing crisis, there are too many rent stabilized apartment units sitting vacant across New York City. At a time when 50% of New Yorkers do not earn enough to meet their basic needs, and 80% of working-class households are rent-burdened, we have an obligation to ensure every habitable housing unit is online, particularly our rent-stabilized units. One of the bills heard, Introduced by Council Member Rivera would help address the symptoms of apartment warehousing. Vacant units, particularly those that are not maintained or secured, pose a danger to residents.

Council Passes Council Member Rivera's Bill to Make Open Culture Program Permanent On Thursday, May 25, City Council passed Int. 0590-2022, which will revive and make permanent the Open Culture program that was established temporarily by local law during the COVID-19 pandemic, and will allow eligible arts and culture institutions to obtain permits to use roadways for events.

Supporting Women and Gender Expansive People in the Criminal Legal SystemOn June 8, City Council passed Council Member Rivera's Int.831-2022 to create a resource navigator program to connect women and transgender, nonbinary, and intersex individuals to alternatives to incarceration and reentry services.
