

Halloween with Team Harvey: Tuesday, October 31st from 3 PM to 6 PM





Breaking Ground on Solar Education Along the East River



Last month, I joined Manhattan Borough President Mark Levine, Councilmember Keith Powers, Senator Brian Kavanagh, Rep. Jerry Nadler's team, NYC Economic Development Corporation, and the Mayor's office to break ground on the Solar 2 Education Center along the East River. Solar 1 is currently New York City's only self-sustaining solar-powered building and during Hurricane Sandy became an integral resource for folks without power.

The <u>new Solar 2 facility</u> will have 2 classrooms to educate young people and the entire community about solar energy. An important aspect of addressing climate change is energy innovation and I am happy to see this happening in District 74.

Advocating for Community Healthcare



In recent weeks, <u>Mount Sinai announced their intention to close Beth-Israel Hospital</u>, a vital community healthcare resource. This announcement comes amid Mount Sinai's attempt to <u>close the</u> <u>New York Eye and Ear Infirmary</u>. Both of these institutions provide critical healthcare to District 74 residents, specifically low and middle-income populations and folks with disabilities.

I released a joint statement with Manhattan Borough President Levine, Councilmembers Rivera and Powers, Assemblymember Glick, Congressman Nadler, and Senator Gonzalez stating our intent to hold Mount Sinai accountable for their actions and exercise all oversight authority possible. Team Harvey will do everything in our power to fight for affordable and accessible health care for our community. Healthcare is a human right.

High School Application Update

The high school application opens on October 3rd after school hours. The deadline to apply is <u>Friday</u>, <u>December 1, 2023</u>. Current eighth-grade (and interested first-time ninth-grade) students in NYC can apply.

Families should access the application via their <u>MySchools.nyc</u> account. Need help creating an account? Watch this <u>tutorial</u>. On MySchools, families can browse schools and programs and learn about open houses and information sessions. Families should add 12 choices to their child's

application and should list these choices in their true order of preference, with their top choice as #1. You can submit a high school application one of the following ways:

- Online with <u>MySchools.</u>NYC
- Through your child's current school counselor
- At a Family Welcome Center (<u>schools.nyc.gov/FWC</u>)

Please note that the nine Specialized High Schools (<u>schools.nyc.gov/SHS</u>) have separate admissions processes that also open on October 3rd! These schools will not show up as options on the general high school application.

- LaGuardia High School has its own application in MySchools. If you are interested, complete the LaGuardia application and submit your audition by Friday, <u>December 1st</u> – learn more about the audition process here: <u>schools.nyc.gov/HSAuditions</u>.
- The remaining Specialized High Schools admit students based on their scores on the Specialized High Schools Admissions Test (SHSAT). Registration for the SHSAT opens on October 3rd and closes <u>on Friday, October 27.</u> Practice tests, test dates, and test locations are available at <u>schools.nyc.gov/SHS</u>

Redistricting Public Input

Due to ongoing legal challenges with the New York Congressional redistricting effort, the commission is seeking public input. The public is invited to submit input by emailing submissions@nyirc.gov or by sending mail to Attention: Submissions, Independent Redistricting Commission, 250 Broadway, 22nd Floor, New York, NY 10007. All submissions received will be made available to all Commissioners and staff.

ESCR Lead Discovery & Mitigation Efforts

ESCR ConEd Line Abatement

We recently received this information from Con Ed:

"ConEd is currently upgrading utility lines in the southern portion of the ESCR PA1 project area, within the Greenway along the FDR Drive west of Pier 42. The improvements ConEd is making to the lines is to strengthen them, which includes applying a carbon fiber epoxy coating. The material, similar to concrete drying, needs to dry without rain, soil, or debris landing on it. This is why the ConEd lines are being covered with plastic tent-like structures.

Asbestos was found on a portion of the lines which is very common for ConEd utilities all over the City. The removal of materials containing asbestos is completed by a ConEd subcontractor certified in asbestos removal. **Over the next month, during the week and weekends, the public may see workers in Tyvek suits as these individuals are in close proximity with the asbestos-containing materials on a daily basis and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is mandatory for their work.** (They also may wear Tyvek suits when applying the epoxy coating, mentioned above, to prevent the epoxy from staining clothing.) The asbestos abatement work is being done in accordance with all local, state, and federal guidelines, and is contained and disposed of as required. This work was completed in the northern portion of East River Park earlier on in the project."
